# FOUNDATION BOARD MEETING HELD IN AUGUST

Respectfully submitted by Harland Danielsen and Tim Schendel, Directors, Scottish Rite Foundation of South Dakota for the Valley of Sioux Falls, events of the meeting as follows;

- 1. The Secretary reported that the IRS Tax form 990 was submitted to the IRS by Eide Bailly. The cost remains the same as last year. Our insurance went up slightly for 2014.
- 2. The Treasurer gave updates on the Life Membership Account, Income and Expenses Statement, Statement of Financial Position, Endowment Contributions (which were down for 2015), and 2014 Budget Review. The acceptance of these reports was moved, seconded and approved.
- 3. Two other financial items were: 1) Website expense for creation and annual fees of \$657 and transfer of \$15,000 to Aberdeen Clinic Support (from 2013 budget). Both items were moved, seconded, and approved.
- 4. President's Report: President Larson discussed membership needs and increasing funds for the Foundation. He encouraged Valleys to have well run Rush Parties. He also discussed the Valley Membership Achievement Project (VMAP). Although participation in VMAP is not mandatory, there are many good, useful ideas in the program which Valleys can use to become better. There will be more discussion in the Orient at a later date. We also need to get our members engaged so that we do not lose them.

#### **Old Business**

- 5. Scottish Rite Library we need to hire someone to finish the library.
- 6. 2015 Foundation Fundraiser using Randy Riggles show. Not all Valleys wanted to participate, so no Valleys need to participate.

#### **New Business**

- 7. Scholarship for Clinic Staff. A \$1000 expense allowance will be offered to each Clinic less any Supreme Council scholarship (generally \$400) to attend the upcoming RiteCare Conference in 2014. Motion was moved, seconded, and approved.
- 8. Fundraising for 2015: A number of items were discussed for fundraising. For any contributions of \$125 or more, a Jacket with the Scottish Rite emblem will be given as an incentive. This activity would begin in January of 2015.
- 9. Charles Kaufman Fellowship: President Larson discussed some opportunities with past SGIG Kaufman, who plans to give some funds to the Foundation with the restriction that they be used for Fellowships. There was some discussion but no action at this time.
- 10. Scottish Rite Foundation Mission Statement: A Mission Statement (see page 6) was presented and a motion to adopt it was made. Motion was moved, seconded, and approved.
- 11. Foundation Bylaws: President Larson discussed our current bylaws, which have not been updated in several years. He then appointed a committee to review them and report back to the Foundation Board. The committee consists of James Hoy (chairman), James Taylor, Scot Mannschreck, and Del Kroon.
- 12. Clinic Reports: Aberdeen has been growing and expecting

# AN INTERVIEW WITH THE GRAND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WILLIAM SIZEMORE II, 33° GC

September 11, 2014

The Sioux Falls Valley's Rite News is honored that III. Sir William Sizemore II, 33° GC has agreed to grant us this interview. Brother Sizemore became Grand Executive Director after having served our Nation in the United States Navy, rising to the rank of Rear Admiral.

Brother Sizemore accumulated over 6,000 hours of flight time and 1,000 carrier arrested landings flying all models of F-14 Tomcat and FA-18 Hornet. Upon his retirement from the Navy he was Chief of Naval Air Training, where he was responsible for all U.S. Navy, U.S. Marine Corps and the U.S. Coast Guard pilot training as well as Naval Flight Officer and Aircrew production and training. Brother Sizemore is married to his lovely Lady Diane and together they have three children, Elizabeth, Becca and Will III.

**RN:** The first question; when and where were you raised a Master Mason?

WGS: December 1990 in Virginia Beach, VA Lynnhaven Lodge #220

**RN:** What brought you into Masonry, and the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry?

WGS: My Father, Grandfather, and all my Uncles were Masons.

RN: Can you tell us a little bit about your family?

WGS: I am most proud to be from a family of U.S. Military Veterans. My Father and Grandfather were both in the Navy and served continuously from 1942 through 1982. My Mother's Brother was in the Army and served in combat in WWII. Both of my Father's Brothers were in the USAF and one was shot down and killed in Action during the Vietnam Conflict. I was in the Navy and served from 1976 until last year. We all volunteered to be in military and we were, or are, Master Masons. I've been married for over 30 years to a woman who is a great patriot and sacrificed much so I could serve. We have three children who are our pride and joy. I think our military families are our Nation's unsung Heroes. They go largely unnoticed and unappreciated outside of military circles. They also undergo great hardships in support of our nation, yet are so inspirational to those who are our pride and joy. They also undergo great hardships in support of our nation, yet are so inspirational to those who are around them and are, in my opinion, one of our Nation's greatest strengths.

**RN:** I would suppose that no interview with a retired Rear Admiral would be complete without asking the obvious question everyone will want to know. Give a brief description of your naval career that culminated with your being elevated to the ranks of Admiralty.

**WGS:** I feel very fortunate and extremely honored to have been given the privilege to serve my nation. I had a rewarding and exciting Navy career and cherish the memories and especially the friendships and bonds I made. I'd do it all over again if given the opportunity and have attached a bio if you want more specifics. (bio available upon request)

**RN:** Your current position at the Supreme Council, what exactly is your title and what do you do? That may seem mundane but some of the readers may not know who you are yet.

WGS: Grand Executive Director. My duties are laid out in the Supreme Council Statutes and essentially consist of being responsible for and overseeing the Supreme Council finances, Supreme Council / House of the Temple Staff, and the care and upkeep of the House of the Temple. I also assist the Sovereign Grand Commander and, in military terms, act as his Chief of Staff.

RN: The Valley of Sioux Falls is attempting, like most Valleys, to have a revival and renewal of our membership. Our numbers have been stagnant to declining, like other Valleys nationwide, in the last few years. The Regional Workshops and the Fellows Program are geared toward helping to solve that problem but, were it totally up to you, what would your first few steps be in an effort to turn this around? **WGS**: The Valley Membership Achievement Project or VMAP is a grass roots, membership focused project whose sole purpose is to help Valleys provide the very best Scottish Rite experience for their members in order for our member to receive value from, and retain their membership in, the Scottish Rite. VMAP is the direct result of the feedback the was received from Scottish Rite members and Leaders at the 2014 Leadership Workshops in Portland, Biloxi, and Williamsburg. A VMAP Committee made up of leaders from around the Scottish Rite was established to study the Leadership Workshop results and it came up with VMAP.

## A LITTLE HISTORY ABOUT THE ORIGINS OF OUR SCOTTISH RITE DOUBLE EAGLE

The symbol most widely recognized as Scottish Rite Masonry is the Double-Headed Eagle of Lagash. It is one of the oldest Royal Crests in the existence. This symbol has been in use at least a thousand years before the Hebrew Exodus from Egypt and more than 2,000 years before the building of King Solomon's Temple.

Records indicate that in the early days of modern Freemasonry the Double-Headed Eagle was first used around 1758 by a Masonic body in Paris. That Masonic body was known as "The Emperors of the East and West", and controlled the advanced Degrees then in use. It is these degrees that became a precursor of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite.

# HISTORY OF OUR DOUBLE HEADED EAGLE

Our Double-Headed Eagle features the white-ribboned motto, pendant from the hilt of the sword to the point, and displaying the Latin "SPES MEA IN DEO EST", which translates "My Hope Is In God". As a Scottish Rite Mason you will recognize this phrase from the lessons taught in the 31°.

Generally, the symbolic meaning of this symbol in the Scottish Rite is that of duality contained in or resolving itself in unity. Among other things, it reminds us that as man we are composed of both body and spirit, that he is both temporary and eternal; that both good and evil exist in the world and that we must perpetually espouse good while opposing evil. It also reminds us that knowledge comes both from study and insight; and that our obligations are both to ourselves and to others; that both faith and reason are necessary.

The various symbols of the Scottish Rite do not easily reveal their meanings to us; furthermore, there may be many meanings to any one symbol. Only after thought and reflection do they fulfill their function and begin to trigger ideas in the mind. \*Reprinted by permission of the Supreme Council, 33

VMAP is not a competition between Valleys or Orients. Any Valley can participate in VMAP and any Valley that does participate will be stronger, better, and will provide a superior Scottish Rite experience for its members. Take a look at the Scottish Rite Website at <a href="http://scottishrite.org">http://scottishrite.org</a> to learn more about VMAP.

**RN:** There has to be an inner drive or a thirst for something more that drives you to be the man you are. In your own words, describe what you believe makes a good man better within Masonry?

**WGS:** That's pretty hard to put into a sentence or two but to me, I think Masonry re-introduces, or in some cases introduces, and reinforces, ideals of thought and behavior that most of us were taught and/or witnessed at some time in our lives. Specifically, thoughts, ideals, and behavior about how we should strive to live our lives and the example we should strive to set in all that we do and say each and every day.

RN: Via your work at the Supreme Council, do you feel that there was a trend of membership growth in the late 40's, late 50's and the early 70's? Speaking for the Sioux Falls Valley and having researched our membership records, that is the case here. It seems to me that Veterans returning home from service in the Military were searching for a place to belong during these times. Maybe we have leaned away, somehow, from attracting our Nation's Veterans; do you think that is a possibility, especially with your background?

WGS: That's an interesting concept and idea. Membership trends are indeed down after peaking in 1980 in the case of the Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction. At the same time, there is a much smaller percentage of Americans that serve or have served in the military and the individual services have been and are still getting smaller. Those downward trends started and have continued since the end of the Vietnam Conflict and Cold War respectively and I expect they will continue despite 13 consecutive years of war. As such there is a smaller pool of current and former military members that could become Masons and then members of the Scottish Rite. That said, there are similarities in thought and deed between our fraternity and the military. We also share very similar core values and I think service members, both past and present, would generally find great value in being a member of the Scottish Rite.

**RN:** One thing seems to always come to my mind when I think of reasons that younger men aren't taking the step from Mason to Scottish Rite Mason, it is a fundamental lack, on our part, of providing functions that aren't just fun, but include our families. What is your take on that notion?

WGS: I think a lot of Valleys do try to have activities and functions that include families. The membership issue is complex and there is no single answer or silver bullet. Members are attracted to and stay in the Scottish Rite for a wide variety of reasons. The bottom line in reversing our membership trends is we need to attract more new members while retaining more existing members that we have been

doing in the recent past. In order to do that, we need provide value to both our prospective and existing members. We need to be a fraternity where men feel welcomed, valued and needed in their Valleys. I think participation in VMAP can be a way for Valleys to provide that value and to ensure our members do feel welcomed, valued and needed in their Valley.

**RN:** Who, in Masonry, has influenced your life to the greatest extent?

**WGS:** My Father of course.

**RN:** We briefly touched on this subject during the Fellows Conference but what are your thoughts about how some members feel like part of the decline in Scottish Rite membership has a little to do with the Shrine dropping the requirement of being in a Rite body before becoming a Shriner?

**WGS:** That certainly didn't help our membership situation but our membership trend had already started to decline before the Shrine changed their Statutes. As I tried to explain earlier, I feel the membership issue is much more complex than just that one facet. 111404474

**RN**: I know you are a very busy man so I will wrap this up. Are there any closing thoughts that you would like our readers to know about you or think of when they think of Scottish Rite Masonry?

**WGS:** I just want the members of the Sioux Falls Valley to know how much we appreciate them, their Masonic service and our shared Brotherhood. I would also remind my Sioux Falls Valley Brothers that the House of the Temple in Washington D.C. is <u>THEIR</u> House of the Temple and to come by and explore it, find me and introduce themselves, to bring their family and friends and to stay as long as they can <u>whenever they visit our</u> Nation's Capital!

**RN:** I would like to once again thank you for your time to answer questions for our Valley's Rite News.

**WGS:** You are most welcome and I look forward to seeing you either in Sioux Falls or during your next visit to the House of the Temple.

#### PIKE TRIVIA

Did you know that, Pike first joined the Independent Order of Odd Fellows in **1840** then had in the interim, joined a Masonic Lodge and became extremely active in the affairs of the organization, being elected Sovereign Grand Commander of the Scottish Rite's Southern Jurisdiction in **1859**? He remained Sovereign Grand Commander for the remainder of his life (a total of thirty-two years), devoting a large amount of his time to developing the rituals of the order. Notably, he published a book called Morals and Dogma of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry in **1871**, of which there were several subsequent editions

Pike served in the Regiment of Arkansas Volunteers as a Captain in **1846** and **1847**. Pike was discharged in June **1847** and his difference of opinion with his former commander culminated in an "inconclusive" duel on July 29, **1847** near Ft. Smith, AR. In **1853**, Pike returned to New Orleans and practiced law until **1857**. An important item to note, Pike commanded no white or black troops, only American Indians.

Pike *was* charged with insubordination and treason (by the Confederate States of America) and was briefly held in Warren, TX but his resignation from the Confederate Army on July 12, **1862** was accepted on November 11, **1862** and he was allowed to return to Arkansas. This all happened *after* his election as Sovereign Grand Commander of the Scottish Rite's Southern Jurisdiction in **1859**.
